We're thrilled to share some fantastic news from North Walsall Primary Academy, who are celebrating not one, but three major national accreditations—a true testament to the school's commitment to excellence, inclusion, and creativity.

NWPA has achieved the Primary Science Quality Mark, a nationally recognised award for outstanding science teaching and leadership. This recognition highlights a commitment to delivering high-quality science education that sparks curiosity and helps children understand the world around them.

"Such success is only possible through the collective effort of the whole school community," said Helen Sizer, PSQM Director. "All those involved should be incredibly proud of this achievement and the positive difference this is making to children's learning."

Adding to their achievements, the academy has also been awarded the Music Mark of Recognition, a new accolade celebrating schools committed to providing high-quality music education. This award recognises the school's efforts to ensure that every child has access to the joy and benefits of music, whether through singing, playing instruments, or creative expression.

These latest awards follow the school's achievement last academic year of Flagship School Status from the Inclusion Quality Mark (IQM). This prestigious status is awarded to schools that demonstrate exceptional inclusive practice and a deep commitment to supporting every child to thrive, regardless of background or ability.

NWPA Principal Sabrina Khera said "We're incredibly proud of our staff and pupils for their hard work and dedication. These awards reflect our shared belief that every child deserves the very best education—one that inspires, includes, and empowers them to achieve their full potential."

We are incredibly proud to share that Bristnall Hall Academy have been nominated for the prestigious *Secondary School of the Year* award in the Education Today School and Supplier Awards 2025.

Education Today has chosen nine nominees who have "made a difference to the learning and lives of [their] pupils, be that through outstanding teaching, great pastoral care or excellent whole school practice". The winners will be announced at a London ceremony in December.

The £6.27m project was funded by the UK Gov Future High Streets fund as part of broader plans to revitalise Sutton's town centre and evening economy.

Since completion, the new theatre has played host to the launch of ATTFE College's In This Together 2025 campaign, which aims to upskill over 2000 people across Nottinghamshire with the CitizenAID qualification, giving them the skills to help in emergency situations before first responders arrive. A host of exciting dramatic performances have also been announced!





Community Spotlight:

Behaviour & Culture



Our ATT Communities are an important vehicle for our work to provide a transformational education to learners across our Trust. Communities are groups of colleagues with representatives from each academy, who work collaboratively to share knowledge and build strategies that help us constantly improve.

For our first Transforming Lives Newsletter, we're shining the spotlight on our Behaviour & Culture Community, which brings together leaders from across our primaries and secondaries to share best practices, develop consistent approaches, and ensure every child feels safe, respected, and ready to learn. Working together, these colleagues focus on strategies that promote high expectations, positive behaviour, and a deep sense of belonging for all students. They're building environments where every child can succeed, academically, socially, and emotionally.

At this month's Behaviour & Culture Community meeting, leaders from our primary and secondary academies came together to reflect on the progress we've made in creating positive learning environments and to plan for the year ahead.

Primary leaders celebrated the success of key strategies like *No Opt Out* and *Right is Right*, which have helped foster a culture of high expectations and student engagement. Secondary leaders shared how their collaborative efforts have led to a reduction in suspensions and exclusions, even as national figures have risen.

A thought-provoking session on the new Ofsted framework, led by Secondary Education Director Garry Trott, encouraged leaders to reflect on how well our support strategies are working for all students, especially those eligible for Pupil Premium, and how we can ensure every child feels a strong sense of belonging.

The community also explored our new Behaviour Connection Plans and Reintegration Meetings, with inspiring insights from Pool Hayes Academy. These initiatives have been designed to support students in returning to learning successfully after time away from school. Academies who have already launched these strategies successfully provided insight on how we can roll them out Trust-wide with consideration for local need.

To close the day, our leaders made personal pledges to focus on improving behaviour and culture for specific student groups, ensuring that every child in our academies is supported to thrive.

We're excited about the year ahead and remain committed to creating safe, respectful, and inclusive environments where all children can succeed.
